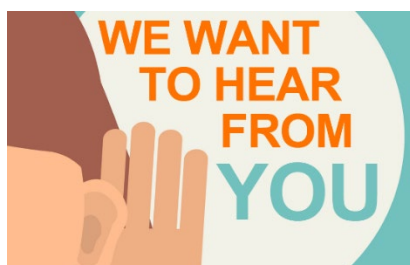

DELEGATIONS

A representative on behalf of Hastings Highlands Interlake Association completed a delegation before Council on a request for a proposed Memorandum of Understanding between Hastings Highlands and the Interlake's Association as a means to formally articulate joint stewardship with Hastings Highlands.



Council passed a resolution requesting reforms to the *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* which is administered by the Ministry of Government and Consumer Services. The reforms are needed to address societal and technological changes in addition to global privacy concerns and consistency across provincial legislation.
