NOTICE OF MOTIONS (Notice Provided)

Council carried a resolution directing staff to prepare and present for Council's consideration an Administrative Monetary Penalty System (AMPS) to be added as a penalty option to the Municipality's Exotic Animal Bylaw (2021-037).

ADMINISTRATION

In late December 2020 staff submitted a funding proposal to the ICIP COVID-19 Resilience Infrastructure Stream Funding Application for the Monteagle Space Retrofit Project.

At the September 1, 2021, Meeting of Council, Council approved the report "**Bylaw 2021-063 Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP): COVID-19 Resilience Infrastructure Stream**" as submitted by the Deputy Treasurer. Council proceeded to pass Bylaw 2021-063 being a bylaw to authorize the execution of the transfer payment agreement.

ADMINISTRATION

CAO/Treasurer David Stewart brought forth a report to Council on the 'Ontario Trillium Foundation Community Building Fund - Capital Stream' which provides support for non-profits, Indigenous communities and Municipalities in the community sport and recreation sectors. In response to the funding announcement, Council directed staff to investigate the cost(s) for a series of upgrades to the Birds Creek recreational space up to a maximum of \$500,000 for submission for the grant program.



NEW MOTIONS

Council directed staff to draft a letter of support for North Hastings Children's Services application for sustainable funding for 'Intersections in North Hastings'. Intersections is an evidence-

informed early intervention program that helps children and youth (8-17) access appropriate supports and services before they become involved in the justice system and/or the child welfare system.



PLANNING DEPARTMENT

Council revoked Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw 2021-021 as it did not meet one of the notice requirements of the *Planning Act*. The Municipality will bring forward two Zoning Bylaw Amendments to bring Bylaw 2004-035 Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw into conformity with the Official Plan. This will ensure Minor Variance Applications remain valid and provides opportunity to review amendments to the Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw.
